Be sure to introduce the characters and setting (time and place) in the beginning, have a problem in the middle, and a solution in the ending.
<b>Count and Order Words</b> Find 10 two-syllable words from a book and write them in ABC order.	<b>Money, Money!</b> Write a detailed story about what you would do if you had \$20.00 to spend. Include an illustration with your writing.	<b>Roll a Problem</b> Use a pair of dice and create 5 addition or subtraction math problems. You may create 2 digit problems to have extra math practice.	<b>Artsy Setting</b> Create a poster of your favorite scene in your book.
<b>Friendly Letters</b> Write a friendly letter to a character in your book. Try to persuade him/her to do something differently. Be sure to include all the parts of a letter.	<b>Be a Word Detective</b> Create a word search from important words out of a book you are reading. Try to include 10-15 words to find.	<b>Be a Reporter</b> Write 5 interview questions for a character in your book and the answers he/she would give to you.	<b>Restaurant Manager</b> Create a restaurant menu. Your menu needs to have 10 items. Write the cost of each item on the menu. Pretend to buy the items with play money or draw the money amounts.
<b>Order up!</b> Choose 5 major events from your story and write them in the correct order.
